General Meeting Minutes Middeton Media Center May 14, 2019 6:30PM

- School update Assistant Principal Downs
  - o Principal Williams is absent due to moving. We wish him well in his move!
  - End of year celebrations and field trips are coming up. Kindergarten and 5<sup>th</sup> grade graduations are in June expect the parking lot to be busy.
  - Science MCAs are complete for 5<sup>th</sup> grade, as well as all other MCA testing.
  - Next Friday will be the first Middleton You Day. Students get to sign up for a class of their choice – dance, arts and crafts, playground, etc., and attend that class next Friday.
  - Kindness month wrapped up with many activities centered around kindness notes with teachers, chalk on the sidewalk, kindness activities in the classroom, etc.
  - 2019/20 Assessment dates are August 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. A link will be sent out along with class placements via Blackboard the second week in August.
  - Only Kindergarten will have an Open House in the fall. Grades 1-5 will have a curriculum night a few weeks after school has started. Watch for more info to be sent out this summer.
  - Kindergarten will start on the first day of school with other 1<sup>st</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> grades next school year.
- School Communicator Heidi Case
  - The district hosted Erin Walsh who presented on the relationship between children, social media and mental health. A few facts from the presentation:
    - Tweens/Teens spend 53 hours/week on media outside of school/homework.
    - Digital technology is not good or bad it's powerful!
    - Ask your children, "What you're posting on social media, would you also post on your school bulletin board?"
    - Try coaching young kids on digital use.
    - Keep phones out of the bedroom at night as they disrupt sleep.
  - Bullying reporting
    - The district has a formal process on how to report bullying. - Budget update/overview Liz Willard
  - Proposed Budget for the 2019/20 school year. Significant changes from last year are as follows:
    - Extra funds have added up over the last 5 years, as well as extra income from fundraisers. We work hard to spend the money responsibly.
    - Estimated revenue is \$47,400, with expenses estimated at \$57,475.
      There are reserves in place.
      - Revenue:
        - We decreased family donations by \$1,000 due to no open house next year.
        - 3M Foundation will donate if 3M employees donate their time.
        - Directories moved from an income item to an expense due to PTO deciding to move to a student directory app format.
        - Carnival income was reduced due to scaling the carnival back – we won't be reaching out to the community as much, but rather putting the focus on classroom baskets.
        - Other events include new adult-only events (i.e.; Board & Brush, Evereve, Tap Room).
      - Expenses:
        - We added more staff in the equation in targeted enrichment.

- Feed the teachers was raised because we'd like to feed the staff more often.
- Year-end celebration was increased to potentially help fund a grade-wide/classroom celebration.
- Mustang Pride was added at Principal Williams's request as he'd like to recognize students for showing Mustang Pride.
- Walk-a-thon next year (no targeted goal yet), but it's in the works and we have many ideas.
- Questions?
  - Kids Club is understaffed, and a parent is curious if PTO can help fund that program. Jenna will follow up with Bob Lawrence.
- Deanna Swanson made a motion to pass the 2019/20 budget. Crystal Rylicki seconded the motion. 2019/20 Budget passed.
